3. CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

We will be celebrating Children's Day on **Thursday, 5 October**. School hours will be as usual. **Friday, 6 October** is the Children's Day school holiday. All students need not report to school on that day.

4. PSLE MARKING

The PSLE Marking Exercise will be held from **Thursday, 19 October to Tuesday, 24 October**. **All students are not required to report to school** on these days.

Students are expected to use the time wisely for academic revision and preparation for their Semestral Assessment 2 (SA2) which takes place after the PSLE Marking Exercise. P1-P5 teachers will provide students with practice papers and answer keys to assist them with their self-study. We seek your support in guiding and supervising your child/ward in his/her studies over the four days. Students are not expected to submit their work for marking when they return to school. **School will resume on Wednesday, 25 October**.

Notes

1. The Weekly Schedule is reviewed at the end of each term. If there are any changes, the school will inform parents/guardians in advance.
2. For remedial/supplementary lessons, teachers will issue lesson details and consent forms. For some lessons, only selected students will be involved.
3. * Higher Mother Tongue (HMT) Lessons for P5 and P6 are conducted in the afternoons. In accordance with MOE policy, **all P5 and P6 HMT students are required to attend the HMT lessons**. These curriculum lessons are conducted on the same afternoons as the P5 and P6 MT Remedial/Supplementary Lessons.
4. For the CCA timeslots, CCA sessions may or may not take up the full duration. Specific details will be provided by the CCA Teachers-in-charge.
5. Additional training sessions for competitive CCAs such as Football, Rock Climbing and Athletics may be conducted on Thursday or Friday, depending on the respective sports competition seasons.
